



# **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

**HIGH ADVENTURE** activities for cadets require above normal paperwork and the approval of the Wing Commander. Please read carefully the guide provided below (Ref: CAPR 60-2), to ensure all safety precautions are taken and the appropriate CAP forms are completed and submitted.

## CADET SAFETY IN ADVENTURE-BASED LEARNING

#### Challenge Activities

- Require review of relevant section in Girl Scout Safety Activity Checkpoints
- Require CAPF 160 Risk Assessment Worksheet
- Require Unit/CC approval
- Require CAPF 60-80 or CAPF 60-81

## Sample Activities Include:

Bouldering (fall < 6 feet)

Camping

Obstacle course (fall < 6')

Climbing walls (artificial)

Hiking (day trip)

Horseback riding at commercial facility

Indoorskydiving

Indoortrampoline

Low ropes (fall < 6')

Laser tag

Mountain biking

Orienteering

Segway riding with commercial tour vendor

Swimmina

Water survival courses

Use CAPF 60-80 for stand-alone events or CAPF 60-81 for CAs occurring within larger activities (e.g., encampment, NCSA)

## **High Adventure Activities**

- Require review of relevant section in Girl Scout safety Activity Checkpoints
- Require CAPF 160
- Require CAPF 60-82 HAA Authorization
- · Require Unit/CC & Wing/CC approval
- Require CAPF 60-80 or CAPF 60-81

## Sample Activities Include:

Backpacking (i.e.: 20-mile Firearms training hikes with a backcountry overnight)

Firearms training or marksmanship

High ropes (fall > 6')

(see 2.7.5 below)

Obstade course (fall > 6')

Paintball (see 2.7.5 below)

Rappelling (in the field or on a tower)

Winter camping (temperatures below 30°F)

Zip lining at commercial facility

Use CAPF 60-80 for stand-alone events or CAPF 60-81 for HAAs occurring within larger activities (e.g., encampment, NCSA)

## **Prohibited Activities**

Never authorized at CAP events

#### Prohibited Activities Include:

Bungee jumping Motorbikes, scooters, snowmobiles & ATVs Hang gliding

Parachuting or skydiving Hunting

Paragliding or parasailing Zorbing

Scuba

Stunt skiing Ultralights

Other CAs and HAAs may be appropriate for the cadet age group; wings are encouraged to consult with CAP/CP before authorizing activities not listed here.
